History & Background of the Saskatoon SPCA

he Saskatoon SPCA began its journey in the community in the 1920's, but it wasn't until 1968 that the organization was incorporated as the Saskatoon Society for Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, a separate entity from the Saskatchewan SPCA. From 1968 to 1991, the Saskatoon SPCA was located in Sutherland. During this time, the demand and need for SPCA services and programs steadily increased and they outgrew the relatively small facility.

In October of 1991, the Saskatoon SPCA relocated to its current location 5028 Clarence Avenue S, just outside Saskatoon city limits. The property includes 3 large dog parks and the building houses both the Saskatoon SPCA as well as the City Pound. The shelter has held the City of Saskatoon Poundkeeping contract for more than 50 years and reunites almost 500 lost animals a year with their owners.

The Saskatoon SPCA is a registered charitable organization that provides care for almost 4000 abandoned, homeless, neglected or abused animals annually from Saskatoon and area. The organization receives some funding for Poundkeeping services but relies upon support from individual and corporate donors. This support ensures that we can provide shelter, sustenance, medical care and enrichment to companion animals in our community that have passed their holding

period in the City Pound. The SPCA provides the public with adoption programs, pound services, lost & found programs, humane education and training programs as well as volunteer programs. The Saskatoon SPCA has had a long history and continues to demonstrate its commitment to the humane treatment of animals.








Walter White's Epic Reunion

alter White disappeared more than three years ago. His family had just moved into a new house, and he couldn't find his

way home. His mom Nikky spent months searching for him. She posted about him online, she came down to the shelter regularly, she submitted a lost report and even posted a reward for his safe return. She did everything possible to find Walter but after a year, Nikky and her family lost hope. They cried

and mourned the loss of
their kitty and tried to
mend their broken hearts.

Three and half years later a good Samaritan brought a handsome, fluffy grey cat to the Saskatoon SPCA. He had been hanging around her yard for a few days and she was worried about him. The front office staff signed him in, and after scanning him for a microchip, they discovered it was Walter White! When Nikky was called, she

dropped everything and raced to the shelter to collect her long lost cat. She was overcome

with joy and gratitude. Both Nikky and the staff witnessing this beautiful reunion had tears of happiness in their eyes.

Jacolen, a long-term Adoption Counsellor with the Saskatoon SPCA,

has witnessed reunions after animals had been missing for 6 months and even a couple around a year, but she told Nikky that she has never seen a reunion take place after 3 ½ years. It can be devastating to lose a pet, but because Nikky had Walter microchipped, he found his way home.

The Saskatoon SPCA microchips every animal that is adopted and recommends updating the information if you move or change phone numbers, so that if your pet ever becomes lost, your happy reunion can take place. If your pet isn't microchipped, check with your local vet as it is a quick, easy procedure.

A Second Chance for Arlene

i I'm Arlene! I was a different dog when I first arrived at the Saskatoon SPCA. I was skinny, scared, dirty and so very hungry. I was also extremely lonely. Today my life looks much different. I have a new family and I am so lucky to have new siblings Ella the Weimaraner and Paisley the Dalmatian who are the best playmates. I'm living the life that I always dreamed of, and its all thanks to you.

Just a few months ago, I had lost all hope. I did not have enough to eat or drink and sadly I did not have a loving family to provide me with the care and attention I needed to be a happy, healthy dog. I wasn't sure could go on much longer.

Then suddenly my life changed.

I felt the gentle hands of an
Animal Protection Officer lift
me up and he whispered you're



going to be okay. He rushed me to the shelter where caring people gave me food and water and most importantly the will to survive. For the first time in my life, I realized that humans can be kind, caring and compassionate.

If you are reading this, you must be one of those people.

My road to recovery wasn't easy. I was so malnourished that I needed to be put on a special diet and feeding program so that my body could adjust. I was also severely under socialized. I didn't know how to be a good dog. My heart was still broken by the mistreatment I had experienced, and I needed to learn how to trust humans again.

Lucky for me once I was stable, I got to go to an incredible foster home. My foster mom helped me learn how to be a confident, happy dog. I had 4 other dogs, a cat and even a pig to play with. I was thriving and making progress every day but what I really wanted was a forever home.

The Saskatoon SPCA cares for thousands of animals every year. Some will need specialized care like me to overcome abuse. Others will need medical intervention or emergency surgery just to survive. Without the support of our community, none of that would be possible. You help animals put their painful pasts behind them and give them the happy life and healthy futures they deserve.



McKell Wascana Conservation Park (Regina)

McKell Wascana Conservation Park is a 171-acre space dedicated to the restoration and conservation of a native prairie and wetland habitat. Developed in partnership with DUC and the McKell family, the park offers four kilometres of groomed nature trails with interpretive stations and benches, a dock for getting close to the creek for pond dipping, and an entry plaza and amphitheater for education programming. Open year-round.

Directions

Located at 12001 Wascana Circle in Regina. Follow Prince of Wales Drive south to Wascana Gate S, turn east to Wascana Circle, turn south and continue for about a half-kilometre.

Chappell Marsh Conservation Area (Saskatoon)

Located in the RM of Corman Park southwest of Saskatoon, this 131-acre habitat project offers a network of trails with interpretive stations, benches and a shelter for educational programming. The marsh has grown into a unique outdoor classroom and education destination and it is open year-round.

From Circle Drive, take the Valley Road Exit. Continue on Valley Road for two kilometres to Cedar Villa Estates Road (Township Road 362A). Turn right and head west for 2.1 kilometres. Turn left on Range Road 3062 and head south for 0.2 kilometres. Park in the designated parking area.

he pandemic has pushed and continues to push many of our day-to-day interactions online. For those familiar and proficient with technology, this presented a mild learning curve, at best. But for those less familiar with the tools, it came along with risk.

There's been a great uptick in the last two years of seniors being more willing to use email and social media. The Canada Safety Council is calling attention to the disproportionate rate of seniors being targeted in online scams.

Read on for useful safety tips to help you identify common scams and prevent yourself from becoming a

- Never share personal information over the phone or email. This includes social insurance numbers. health card numbers, passwords and personal identification numbers. The phone and email are unsecured connections and you can't be sure the person on the receiving end is who they say they are.
- Share no information on cold calls. If someone calls you and begins asking for information, inform them that you would be more comfortable hanging up and calling back. Always use a publicfacing phone number to call back – do not simply dial the number that appeared on your caller ID or a number given to you by the caller.
- Do not open emails, attachments or messages from people you don't know. They may be intentionally exposing you to a virus or a program that will log your activity. If you don't know and trust the sender, simply delete the message.
- Do not be intimidated. Many scammers use this method, where they will attempt to intimidate and bully you into paying them or giving them information. It is designed to catch you off-quard and to make you assume you did something wrong. Your focus should be on what is being said, not how it is being said. This tactic is also typically used in cold calls and should be paired with the advice above.

If you fear you may have been victimized by a scam, you should report the incident with your local police or log it through the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre.


