Our meet is held in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, Canada annually each January or February. The January 2019 edition will be our 54th annual meet. Our competition site is the Saskatoon Fieldhouse, a 200 metre flat track with seating for 3500 spectators.

Along with the 3000 plus elementary school students and Special Olympic athletes who compete in our meet, we bring in 35 to 40 of the top international track and field athletes who reside in North America and beyond to compete in the invitational section of the meet.

Our goal in hosting this meet is to provide the youth of Saskatchewan with positive role models by having the elementary school students compete in the same meet as the international stars. We also provide the students of Saskatchewan schools the opportunity to meet and talk with these international athletes, about the value of setting goals and overcoming hurdles in life. These international athletes travel to Saskatoon early to visit inner-city schools around Saskatchewan.



Big River was built as a company town for the lumber industry and has a rich history of logging, forestry and tree-planting.



Competitors to watch for at the Kof C Games

winter. Time for hurdler Michelle Harrison (Young) to crack open a new season. Harrison, 26, gives the 2019 K of C Games gloss. She is a Saskatoon athlete competing in an international field. She'll notice the time she runs and where she finishes. What is more important is what the race tells her. She'll know where she's at. What she does indoors in January is a hint at what might happen outdoors in July. "I often get caught up focusing on my time after every race," Harrison said. "I have learned that it is more important to create small goals throughout the season. "Being patient and working hard to achieve these small goals will pay off. Success will come in the long run when it counts."

Michelle Harrison (Young)

Last summer was a scorcher. She ran 13.28 seconds in the 100-metre hurdles, her best time ever and the third-fastest in 2018 by a Canadian. She has been hitting 13-and-change since 2013. The faster she goes the more precise she is. She has to be. Figuring out hurdles is a job

for an X-Acto knife in spikes. If she brushes a hurdle with her clearing leg or her heel recovery is too high, she loses time. Every bit counts. In a world of 13-second sprints, fractions are huge. In the land of hurdles, Harrison rules.

As a Grade 12 student at Evan Hardy Collegiate she won 6 gold medals at the High School Provincial meet, setting 2 records. With the University of Saskatchewan Huskies, she won a Canada West conference title and the U SPORTS national title in the 60m hurdles. She also holds the record as the fastest Huskie in the 60m and 60m hurdles all time. She's also been to the World University Games.

"Two years ago I was hurt and unable to compete," she said. "Therefore, it's hard to say what I have improved on. I am just happy to be competing healthy again. "I am working on coming off of the hurdle faster and spending less time in the air over the hurdle." She is a package deal. She is attitude and action.

"The K of C games is a meet I look forward to competing in every year," Harrison said. "I remember competing in the Games in elementary school. I thought it was so cool watching the invitational athletes. I would have never dreamed that one day I would be competing in the invitational event."

Another competitor, Kayden Johnson, age 22, is a sprinter and hurdler. When he runs in the K of C Games this month in the Field House, the stands will be full, the track busy and the noise

big. That's Games tradition, has been since Saskatoon started the annual indoor athletics meet 54 winters ago. Johnson calls it background noise. With his mind on the race, the Field House is as loud as a nun's sneeze.

Making it quick takes time. In the hour before the race he visualizes and stretches. He takes another hour after the race to cool down. If it's not race day, he is at the track training. He is in the weight room. He eats smart. He deep sleeps. Hurry up is his goal. Getting fast takes patience. Slow down, he tells himself. A 10-second sprint is vears in the making.

Johnson first came to the K of C Games from Kindersley almost a decade ago, not to run, to watch. His father, Winchester, competed in the K of C Games in the 1980s and went on to break the Saskatchewan record in decathlon, finishing third in the run, jump and throw event at the 1991 Canadian track and field championships in Montreal. His mother, Angy, played soccer and basketball for the University of Saskatchewan Huskies. Angy and Winchester have schooled Kayden and his two brothers in sport.



Q: What can I do if my neighbour is smoking cannabis and the smell is bothering me?

A: If your neighbour is consuming cannabis on their private property (this includes the backyard), they are doing so legally and Police are not able to intervene.

Q: How long do I have to wait after consuming cannabis before I can drive?

A: The length of time that THC metabolites remain in your body depends on a variety of factors: frequency of use (occasional vs. daily), potency (THC level in the cannabis), and dosage (how much you consume). It is also affected by individual characteristics like weight, body fat composition, age, and gender; therefore it is impossible to provide a specific answer as to how long it takes for evidence of cannabis use to leave your system.

Q: Where can medicinal marijuana patients legally take their medication?

A: In a private residence or on private property.

Q: How many plants can I have?

A: At outlined in the Federal Cannabis Act, each household is legally allowed four plants for personal cultivation. This does not mean four plants per person per household.

Question & Answer session on the use of Cannabis

Q: What are federally-approved screening devices? And what do they do?

A: Police have two options; either the Standard Field Sobriety Test (SFST) or an Oral Fluid Test.

The only federally-approved screening device available to Canadian Police as of October 17, 2018, is the Drager Drug Test 5000 System. This is a roadside device used in patrol cars that test your saliva for the presence of cannabis and cocaine. It provides either a positive or negative reading and is not a quantitative measurement of THC. If the device displays a "positive"

- reading," you are subject to immediate roadside suspension.
- If Police determine that you are impaired, you will be arrested and subject to further testing (Evaluation by a Drug Recognition Expert -D.R.E. - or a blood test).

Q: How are Police going to determine impairment?

A: At this point in time, through a SFST (used to test for the presence of all drugs and alcohol) or by the evaluation of a Drug Recognition Expert (DRE). Being found impaired could lead to criminal charges.

"They taught me the base," he said. "I grow from that and try to surpass them. "If I'm hot-headed about something I'll ask them questions. They watch practice. They watch video. They see things I don't."

Sports are in his blood and bio.
Kayden played bantam hockey
for the Kindersley Klippers. He
was co-captain on his high school
basketball team at Lutheran
Collegiate Bible Institute in
Outlook. Last May he was among
a group of athletes in Winnipeg
for one of the regional camps in
the national RBC Training Ground
program to identify Olympic
prospects in all kinds of sports.
Kayden, who is 6-foot-3 and 200plus pounds, posted the best test
results at the camp. In a show

of power, speed and endurance, he had scouts from Bobsleigh Skeleton Canada and Rugby Canada doing somersaults.

For now his commitment is to track and football. Being a fourth-year theatre student at York University in Toronto, school and sports is a heavy load. He plays running back for the York Lions, finishing 10th in the conference in yards rushing last season and scoring four touchdowns. Although he holds the Saskatchewan record in decathlon for the under-20 age class, set in 2015 when he finished fifth at the Panamerican Junior Athletics championships, he decided to target his best track events. He picked sprints and hurdles, a casserole of raw speed

and refined technique.

The meat of his 2018-19 indoor season at York is the Ontario university conference championships in late February and the U SPORTS national championships in early March. He won the Canadian university 60-metre hurdles title last year.

Johnson is tall. He is wide. His arms are tattooed from shoulder to elbow, side to side. His dreadlocks are so long they finish a race a full second after he does. "Not your typical sprinter build," he said. He doesn't have to run up and over the hurdles. He can blast through them. "I've done that," he said. "I lived to tell the story. They didn't." Someone forgot to tell the hurdles to wear Kevlar.

Danceland has been welcoming visitors for almost 90 years. The historic structure has welcomed big band acts from 40's, rock 'n roll legends, polka kings, and country music acts from Nashville. There is even the famous rumour that The King himself, Elvis Presley, once graced the stage with his blue suede shoes along Hank Snow in 1953.

Today, Danceland still welcomes acts from all over North America and continues to be a major tourist attraction for the resort community of Manitou Beach and the province. When you combine it with Manitou Springs Resort & Mineral Spa, Manitou & District Regional Park, a 9-hole golf course, a drive-in movie theatre, numerous art galleries, and of course the legendary unsinkable waters of Little Manitou Lake, you have one of the 'must-see' destinations in all of Saskatchewan. But being a large concert hall on the shores of a closed-basin lake on the prairies does come with some challenges.

Though the recent high water levels on Little Manitou Lake have


started to rescind since the start of 2017, water did accumulate beneath the structure forcing the ownership with expensive repairs to the piles that hold the building in place.


Owner Millie Strueby said they have a goal of \$350,000 to make the necessary repairs. "Phase one, we had done that in September, which was jacking and leveling of the building, and we can really tell the difference here, but more work needs to be done," Strueby said. "So that's one of the reasons why we're doing fundraising events such as galas."

Strueby said in a recent interview with 620 CKRM. Strueby said they formed a committee, a committee formed to raise funds in order to 'save Danceland.' "We would hate to lose a thing of the past, something that made Manitou Beach what it is today," Strueby said. "We would hate to lose that building, so that's why we're trying our very hardest to try to keep it going, trying to keep the building intact."





nowmobiling has become a very popular winter sport for Canadians. There are currently over 700,000 registered snowmobiles in Canada and over 125,000 kilometres of

Every year people are injured and killed while participating in a pastime that should be remembered with only fond memories. Injuries and deaths that are related to snowmobiling can be prevented. Frequently reported contributing factors in collisions include excessive speed, drowning, unsafe operation, inattention, and operating under the influence of alcohol.


One of the safest snowmobiling rules is never to cross lakes or rivers. Besides the danger of plunging through the ice, you have far less traction for starting, turning and stopping on

ice than on snow. Collisions on lakes account for a significant number of accidents. Don't hold the attitude that lakes are flat, wide-open areas, free of obstructions. Remember, if you can ride and turn in any direction, without boundaries, so can other riders. The threat of a collision, then, can come from any direction.

However, if you do snowmobile on the ice, make absolutely sure the ice is safely frozen. Don't trust the judgment of other snowmobilers. You are responsible for your own safe snowmobiling.

Drowning is a leading cause of snowmobile fatalities. Consider buying a buoyant snowmobile suit. If you go through the ice, remember that your snowmobile suit (even a non-buoyant one) and helmet may keep you afloat for several minutes. Slide back onto the ice, using anything sharp to dig in for better pull. Kick your feet to propel you onto the ice, like a seal. If the ice keeps breaking, continue moving toward shore or the direction from which you came. Don't remove your gloves or mitts. Once on the ice, roll away from the hole. Don't stand until well away from the
